INDIA, US COP CHIEFS MEET TO EVOLVE PLAN

India, US cop chiefs meet to evolve plan

Tnn, New Delhi

Conceding that both India and US were the leading targets of transnational terror groups, with attacks launched from across sovereign borders intended to cause greatest disruption of peace, Indian Union home minister Sushilkumar Shinde yesterday sought enhanced cooperation between the two countries to “secure our cities and our people”. Addressing the India-US police chiefs’ conference — the first ever mega-city policing cooperation between the Americans and another country — Shinde recalled the 9/11 attacks in New York as well as the 26/11 Mumbai strikes to emphasise how terrorists typically targeted large and densely populated urban areas to inflict maximum damage. The two-day police chiefs conference is being held as a part of the India-US Homeland Security Dialogue, a decision taken when US President Barack Obama visited India in November 2010.
